Summer Session Highlights!

- 39 total kids were enrolled in sessions during the summer, for our biggest season yet!
- I was able to completely clear the waiting list that had grown over the spring, by getting 19 new kids started in Horse Care groups throughout the summer!
- We were able to give my first advanced rider the opportunity to complete a year of 4-H
 and participate in the Wayne County Fair—Go Payshence and Pistol! (shown at right)
- ♦ 19 summer sessions required scholarships, totaling \$1,290 in scholarships given for the summer!

Orrville Area United Way

This Spring I was excited to learn that the Orrville Area United Way would be giving out six Special Summer Grants of \$5,000 each to non-profit organizations that provide services to the Dalton, Marshallville, and Orrville area. Orrville Area United Way focuses funding in the impact areas of Nurturing Children and



Youth, Developing Life Skills, Helping in Hard Times, and Promoting Health and Wellness. What we provide at Stirrup Courage could hit all of those target areas, so I jumped into completing the grant application. We were honored to be one of the applicants chosen by the committee, and the \$5,000 grant helped supply our scholarship fund for the many deserving kids this summer, and funded the development of our horse book library corner to encourage our students to read and learn more about a favorite topic outside of class!

We knew our sweet, gentle Belle was an old girl, but we would have hoped to still have more good years with her. However, as spring moved toward summer, Belle began giving us signs that her old body was nearing the end of its long, full life. I knew it was time to retire Belle from classes and move her to the "retirement pasture" at my home to enjoy some quiet time of

grazing and calm companionship with current retirees Glory and Boomerang. I wanted to give Belle's donor, Emma (pictured at left), and her mom, Demi, a chance to come spend time with their old girl for what we knew would likely be their last goodbye, before calling in the vet to confirm that the time had come to let Belle go peacefully.

Belle was the first horse donated to our program when we moved into the new barn. Belle was a petite, smooth-gaited mare who helped build confidence in so many of our students in the time she was with us, valued by children for being "just my size," her ability to stand complete-

ly still for grooming, and her slow, calm demeanor that made her an easy first horse partner for any beginner rider. She was exactly what we needed to get our program started with so many new riders and younger children starting out through that first fall and winter indoors, and we are so thankful for all the fond memories so many children will have of her as the first horse they learned how to groom, lead, ride, and love! 
A Fundraising Family

building projects! Thank you, Steiner cousins, and everyone who attended and donated towards their event!





We are also ending the year with an amazing count of over 50 names on my list of volunteers who made the program happen this year, from class mentors to stall cleaners!
